I Committee Reports

A. Spring Fling, Chairman, Ernestine Bash.-The Spring Celebration was held Sunday April 28th from 5-7:30 PM at the Sawyer House at 40 Main Street, the new home of the Cornish Historical Society. The music was provided by Puckerbrush. Food and beverages were served by Krista. Very generous businesses and friends donated 52 items for bidding at the silent auction. It was a most successful and fun evening. One complaint was that there was not enough seating. A full report is filed with the Spring Celebration file. The proceeds from the ticket sales and silent auction totaled \$ 1,055.50. This money will be divided between The Bonney Memorial Library and The Cornish Historical Society.

B Crosswalks- Painting of the crosswalks will be put on hold since route 25 will be paved this summer. If the paving is delayed until August it was agreed that the white lines should be painted. The brick pattern on the crosswalks is questioned. When the new paving is complete the state

would paint the cross walks if the brick pattern was deleted. Scott is trying to find out who the responsible group is for deciding whether or not there should be a brick pattern. He will attend a town meeting to try and find out.

C. Flags- The flags will be on display by Memorial Day. A request was made to have them up for the veterans program that is scheduled this week, but there is not enough time to have this happen. Brad Perkins and Ron McKinney are putting up the flags. A third volunteer would be most helpful. Call Ron or Brad if you would like to help.

D. Membership- There has been confusion about membership and brochure and web listings. There was discussion and the membership voted to have the board make a by-law change for 2014. One owner will constitute one membership. The fee \$60.00, at present, would be the annual membership fee. If the owner had more than one business or wanted to be listed in more than one category on the web site and brochure, the owner would pay \$20.00 each for additional listing. The board will be contacted to make the appropriate changes for the coming year. Remember you can join CAB at any time during the year and you will be on the web site.

F. Scholarship- Brad Perkins reported that his committee had met and an individual deserving of the CAB Scholarship was chosen. The recipient will receive the award at graduation. The \$500.00 will be sent to the institution after successful completion of the first semester.

G. Brochures- The brochures have been printed and are available for tourists at Kittery and Fryeburg. If any business would like brochures for their business you may pick them up at Midway Lodging.

G. Marketing- The web site continues to be successful. Businesses are also advertising their events on the newly added event calendar. Last week Cornish was named Town of the Week on the morning program on Channel 13. It was also announced on Face Book. What great publicity. CAB is also getting a banner to be used at all events. Scott showed us the design. They plan to order it from Mr. Print. The cost will be around \$80.00.

H. Kiosk- The kiosk has been painted and the brochure holders are in place. Four of the six holders have been rented for the season. The updated map on the back of the kiosk has not been put up yet. The business that designed the map last year has not responded so far. If they are not interested someone else will be contacted so that the map will be up quickly.

I. Strawberry Festival- Shannon is working on the plans for the Strawberry Festival. She is looking for vendors and, volunteers to help with the event on June 29th.

A. Daffodils- This project met with mixed success. So far very few of the 450 planted at the park are visible. Weather may have contributed to the weak showing in some areas.

B. The Christmas lights were taken down. It is noted that 25 small lights and 50 large lights are needed for the coming year.

C. Apple Festival- Vendor forms go out June 1st for the Apple Festival.



The meeting was adjourned at 8PM. The next meeting will be at the UCC Church on June 11th.
