



The CAB Minutes for November 9, 2010

The CAB Meeting was called to order at 7:20 PM after a social time with refreshments. There was a quorum present. The following members attended: Cornish Historical Society, Bangor Savings Bank, Scenic Roots, Scott Design, Cottage Treasures, MacIntyre Consulting, The Barking Rose Quilt Barn, Sacopee Valley Eye Care, Midway Lodging and Your Weekly Shopping Guide.

The Treasurer reported a balance of \$7,543.37 after expenses which included \$50.00 for the restrooms, Apple Fest postage of \$37.60 and \$674.00 to Your Weekly Shopping Guide for Apple Fest Ads and Road Race Ads.

I. Current Business

A. Christmas in Cornish- There is an ad in the Shopping Guide this week for the Memory Lights. The Wreaths and roping have been purchased from Lisa Pease. A volunteer, Sheena Randall has donated 5 strings of LED lights for the tree. Lisa and Michael from the Cornish Trading Company have offered their ladders to help with the tree decorating. CAB plans to decorate the park on Sunday, November 28th at 9:00 AM. Volunteers are needed to help with this effort. Please contact Scott Rowley if you can help. The tree lighting will take place in the park on Friday, Dec.3rd. Lisa Twombly of Lily's has contacted Rich Rhulin to lead the carol singing again this year. Expenses for Christmas in Cornish will be paid by CAB in addition to the \$400.00 which the town voted upon to support the effort. On Sunday the Cornish Historical Society will host a Victorian Tea at the United Church of Christ to add to the festivities. Watch for more information about this.
