- D. Membership Committee- All At Once Agog has just joined. The Stone Ridge Restaurant is now under new ownership. CAB Will visit and welcome them.
- E. Scholarship Committee- This committee will meet in the coming week so that the scholarship can be presented at commencement. Last year's recipient was Paige Shortsleeves.
- F. Marketing- This year 4,000 brochures are placed at the visitor's centers in Fryeburg, Kittery and Yarmouth. They are also available for your local businesses and may be picked up at Midway Lodging or Bolt. CAB also voted to place a \$60.00 listing in the Bandstand Program.
- G. Flags- Shannon Surette has agreed to chair this program. Some of the flags are flying and the rest will be in place for Memorial Day. There is a program to buy an honor star at a cost of \$5.00 for the year in honor or memory of a service person. This will help to defray the cost of replacing the flags.
- H. Strawberry Festival- The festival will take place on June 28th. Vendors are arranging for space. Danika Denison is working on the music. Pickers are needed on June 26th to go to Doles to gather berries. Merle Gogins will be making the biscuits again. Patty Rowley will make gluten free biscuits.
